REFLECTION TIME

Our family just returned from a vacation to Wisconsin. School is underway in most settings. Football games are right around the corner. We are moving to the end of summer. The fall season is coming. For me, this is a time to "Look Back and Look Ahead." I think about the well-known words from Jeremiah 29:11, "I know the plans I have in mind for you, declares the Lord . . ." (CEB)

In his book, *The 15 Invaluable Laws of Growth*, leadership guru, John Maxwell, shares insights into healthy reflective discipline.

The first component for Maxwell is **Investigation**. This step involves looking back on our recent experiences. In doing this, we dig into what we have learned, loved, and need to leave behind as children of God.

The second component for this leader is **Incubation**. It's here we take the proper time to ponder deep and helpful thoughts. We also consider new ideas, pathways, or avenues for ministry and life in general.

The third component is **Illumination**. The lightbulb comes on in this step. We ruminate so we can learn lessons about life. This step allows us to define what really matters in life.

Finally, Maxwell encourages us to focus on **Illustration**. He says we should ask questions like "What can I apply?" "What can I change?" and "What can I teach to others?". Maxwell says we often overlook this piece about teaching to others. But it's true, we master a new concept by teaching it to others.

So we can focus on Investigation, Incubation, Illumination, and Illustration. But however it comes together for us, might we take the appropriate time to look back and look ahead this time of year!

"I refuse to see this as a tragedy"

*** Marion and Rich Patterson, who live up the hill from us, have become great friends, mentors, and of course, neighbors! We have enjoyed morning walks with our puppy, Macrina, up to their house to begin the day by walking through the Phoenix Harmony Labyrinth, which sits on the land in front of their house. We have enjoyed the unexpected glass of wine on their back porch when passing through, looking *** out at Faulks Heritage Woods, which like many forests in this neighborhood got hit by the derecho. ***********

In many ways, Marion and Rich are naturalists to where Rich spends the night outside sometimes. They're both in the business of land restoration and are helping us to restore our land to the woodlands it was created to be.

On the anniversary of the derecho, they held a healing gathering, sharing what they have noticed since the derecho. The trees in the backyard, the edge of the woods went down from the derecho. All the ferns underneath have begun to shrivel up due to getting too much sun. What has taken place is incredible. Change has happened for thousands of years, and creation continues. Creation heals itself. As the ferns have dried out, other plants have taken root. Native plants, whose seeds have been present in the soil waiting for the right conditions to sprout, have popped up all over where the ferns and other shady plants had previously been. Rich refuses to see the derecho as a tragedy as change consistently happens and creation heals itself.

They have done very little to their little piece of the world, but have only helped nature to heal itself, for trees to decompose, for new plants to grow, and protecting new seedlings.

By refusing to see this as a tragedy, it isn't denying what happened and the real trauma it brought to our lives and creation, but it is acknowledging that destruction and this tragedy doesn't have the final word. God always has the final word. By refusing to see this as a tragedy, it's acknowledging that love and goodness, the healing power of God have the final call. God is transforming everything into goodness, and that's something to celebrate. Pastor Kristina


