# **Disciplines for the Journey**

This month we move into the season of Lent. Lent is a season of spiritual preparation that leads to Holy Week and Easter. Lent is forty days and forty nights that recalls Jesus's surrender and retreat into the desert. Whereas Easter rejoices in the resurrected Christ, Lent recalls the events leading up to his death at the hands of the Roman government.

I believe we need to take Lent seriously. Essentially, we cannot rightfully get to the joy of Easter without the self-sacrifice of Lent. As New Testament scholar N.T. Wright says, "Lent is a time for discipline, for confession, for honesty, not because God is mean or fault-finding, but because God us wants us to know the joy of being cleaned out, ready for all the good things in store."

I think we do ourselves and others a favor when we engage in the spiritual disciplines this time of year. Spiritual disciplines are regular actions undertaken to aid in our personal development and cleaning out process. Spiritual disciplines were important to Jesus. They should be important to us too!

Now spiritual disciplines are numerous in variety and scope. Common disciplines are prayer, fasting, worship, journaling, and service. In Mark 1:35 we read, "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed." (NIV) Prayer was critical to Jesus. Also important were the other disciplines lifted up.

About these disciplines too, Jesus would say in Matthew 6:1, "Be careful not to do your acts of righteous to be seen by others. If you do, you will have no reward in heaven." We are to do what we do in humility. We do not engage in the disciplines for show, but for our own benefit as disciples for Christ!

Might we take Lent seriously! This is an incredible journey that leads to the incredible joy of Easter! Many blessings to each of you, Scott

#### Nourished's Lenten Series: Sabbath As Resistance

Our society's culture is one that pushes us to be successful, to climb the ladder to the top, and makes us believe that we are never good enough. Our work is never complete. There's always more we can be doing. When we've finished one project, society tells us we can't rest, but must start working on the next thing. And if we take any vacation or time for rest, then we're seen as lazy and incompetent. It's no wonder so much vacation time goes unused each year throughout this country. This is a huge problem to our mental, spiritual, physical, and emotional health. It's especially a problem for those living on the margins who are working multiple jobs and the idea of a vacation is far from their minds because they simply don't have time and can't afford it. We're overworked to the point of breakdown.

For this Lenten season, we are resisting the ways of society through Sabbath. Our conversations at Thursday Centering will center around the systemic injustice of no rest in a max out culture, identifying what Sabbath is and how we can rest, and feasting on the Sabbath together in community.

Trinity Lane Preschool is Moving! We are excited to announce that our Children's Weekday Ministries' (CWM) mission preschool, Trinity Lane, will move to a new location for the 2022-23 school year. What started as an outreach preschool on the west side has become a well-respected preschool program known in our community for its quality programming and staff, and heart for working poor families. We provide many scholarships so that any child can attend our program. For the last 4 years we've been renting space in the old St. Ludmila's Elementary School that closed in 2019. We previously partnered with Trinity United Methodist Church on 3rd Ave. SW, but in 2019 they put their building up for sale and merged with St. James UMC. You know the saying of when one door closes, another one opens? That is exactly what happened. GOD had a plan for us to keep our program going. We needed to move out of Trinity UMC the same month St. Ludmila's Elementary shut their doors. It was a huge relief and blessing to find a new location. Literally weeks before we were to announce we were no longer going to be able to continue our program, we saw the article in the paper about the Catholic school closing and the rest is history. It was good to see 2 different denominations come together for the sake of the children in need in our community. However, with that said, St. Ludmila's is moving forward with future plans for their church. They are planning on tearing down the old school building and building a brand new Christian education center and gymnasium. So once again we started looking for a new location. Another door opened forming a new partnership with Asbury UMC. We feel so excited for this new opportunity to be back in a United Methodist church. Even though we are eternally thankful to St. Ludmila's for taking us in when we desperately needed a space, it is time for us to move on. Asbury UMC will allow us to form a full partnership in ministry vs. purely renting space. Some of you met trustees from Asbury during a recent Sunday service. They are excited to welcome this ministry into their building and be directly involved in helping us serve families on the SW side of Cedar Rapids. Starting this summer our preschool will be referenced as "Trinity Lane Preschool at Asbury." We will move over to our new location in June. There will only need to be minor construction done inside to have the rooms ready for DHS and the 65 children who will be attending in the fall. The big project will be building a playground, which we are in the process of applying for grants to support. We plan to have an open house early next fall. Asbury is located at 350 27th Ave SW, Cedar Rapids.

Steve Pudinski leads this class that meets in Rm. 205 (1st room on the left in the education part of the bldg.). Both adult classes meet at 9:30 AM.
