Spreading the Good News

"Praise the Lord. Praise the Lord, my soul.

I will praise the Lord all my life."

(Psalm 146:1-2, NIV)

I love history! I love to read about American history and sports history. I enjoy hearing relatives share family history too. I am constantly learning about those who came before me.

As much as anything, I love church history. It is remarkable that a movement led by Jesus of Nazareth and his followers became the largest body on the face of the earth. In a context that included the dominant Roman Empire and Jewish rituals and regulations that dictated the daily lives of many, Jesus emerged as a leader unlike any person we have known. This movement and development of the church that followed his resurrection changed the world.

An understanding of the church's history helps us understand our story today. An old quote by Charles Wolf, Jr. goes, "those who don't study the past will repeat its errors." We move forward as the church by understanding the past. Noted Christian author, Phyllis Tickle, writes in her book, *The Great Emergence*, that every 500 years the church makes a significant shift. Old forms of spirituality are replaced with new expressions of the faith. This does not mean that previous forms are obsolete. They just lose their place as the dominant form of Christianity.

For Tickle, the great shifts involved Constantine in the late Fourth and Fifth Centuries, the schism between the West and the East in the Eleventh Century, and the Reformation in the Sixteenth Century. She writes that church life is currently in the midst of the Postmodern era of the Twenty-First Century. Changes are taking place.

This month I will take a look at each of these periods with a preaching series in worship entitled, "Spreading the Good News." I will look at each of the 500 year periods, reflect on lessons learned, and consider ways we can move forward by looking at the past. I hope you can join us on the journey!

"Andy's Song"

Music is memory. When I hear specific songs, I'm brought back to a specific moment or place in time. My Grandma Audrey, who died 10 years ago, loved to sing. With the most beautiful voice, she had a song for every occasion. Sitting on the pier with her, blowing bubbles, she would sing, "I'm forever blowing bubbles, pretty bubbles in the air," the classic song by Doris Day. When my grandpa would toss pennies at us while playing in the sand—to buy tasty ice cream down the street of course—Grandma would sing, "Every time it rains, it rains pennies from heaven." Even her kitchen had Wisconsin Public Radio's classical channel on all the time. Whenever I hear classic music, I'm transported to sitting at the kitchen table with Grandma, looking out the row of windows, reflecting on the lake water that their property was on. Music is memory and can bring us back to countless moments in time.

A hymn my grandma loved and adored was "In the Garden." At church hymn sings and family gatherings-which always included music as we are all very musical—Grandma always requested this beloved hymn.

I come to the garden a lone while the dew is still on the roses, and the voice I hear falling on my ear, the Son of God discloses. And he walks with me, and he talks with me, and he tells me I am his own; and the joy we share as we tarry there, none other has ever known.

My grandma referred to this hymn as "Andy's Song." "Andy" walked with me. "Andy" talked with me. I think there were many reasons my grandma loved this "Andy's Song." My grandma loved nature. She spent countless days sitting on the pier or on the back porch, basking in the sun and enjoying the sounds of nature. Grandma was consistently connected to nature, and I believe it was where she experienced God. After being diagnosed with macular degeneration, my grandma went blind. I believe that this song in particular was one of comfort for grandma. No matter what she went through, God was with her, journeying with her, talking with her, and always telling her that she was one of God's children. It was comforting for Grandma, and it remains a comforting and hope filled song for me. Whenever I hear it, I'm brought back to sitting on the pier or on the back porch, with my grandma, sitting in silence together. I know God was there! Peace, Pastor Krístíma

Join the Iowa UMVIM work trip to Louisiana in September

The Iowa United Methodist Volunteer in Mission Committee (UMVIM) is planning a disaster response work trip to Lake Charles, Louisiana from September 24 - October 2, 2022, Over the past few years, the Southwest Louisiana area has been hit hard by a series of natural disasters, including hurricanes, tornados, flooding, and extreme cold. Residents were only beginning to recover from one disaster when the next one struck, and hundreds of people are still in need of assistance and hope.

Bill Howell, formerly of Coon Rapids and a frequent disaster response volunteer with the lowa UMVIM, serves as the Director of the Office of Missional Engagement and Outreach for the Louisiana Conference. Bill oversees their disaster response ministry, and together with his wife Katherine leads their effort to meet the needs of the people of the Louisiana Conference.

In January, a team of volunteers from the Iowa Annual Conference traveled to the Lake Charles area for two weeks of work, worship, prayer, and connection with those affected by the recent disasters. The team hung drywall, painted, reconstructed interior rooms, and installed windows — but most importantly shared their love and gave hope to those in need of experiencing God's grace and love.
