## The Glory of Easter

Bishop William R. Cannon was fond of declaring that our faith is based on three historical events . . . a manger crib, an old rugged cross, and an empty tomb. On Easter Sunday, we declare the good news of the empty tomb. In 1 Corinthians 15:12-14 we read, "Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain." (NRSV)

These words from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians are the earliest biblical reference to Jesus's resurrection and the good news of the empty tomb. Paul wrote this letter from the Asian city of Ephesus around 54 or 55 A.D. Mark's Gospel, the first gospel written, will not come together until 70 A.D. or so. Paul is giving us the straightforward truth, taught to him by the early leaders in the church.

This truth of the resurrection is powerful and impressive. Paul makes it clear that if Jesus did not rise from the dead, then preaching is profitless. If Jesus did not come back to life, then our witness is worthless.

Fortunately for us, the eternal truth is that Jesus did rise from the dead. With this good news, we know that our efforts to proclaim the gospel are profitable and worthwhile, meaningful and significant!

A story is told of a foreign gentleman who embraced the Christian faith. This individual was asked why he came to say "yes" to the Risen Lord! The man replied, "It's like this. If you are walking along and come to a fork in the road and two people are there, and one is alive and one is not, which person are you going to take directions from?"

That really is what it comes down to. We have the right and freedom to choose how we live. But with pride and honor I choose to follow the one who lives and reigns forever and ever.

On Easter Sunday, we are given the opportunity to choose our Risen Savior and embrace the new opportunities and possibilities that come with a faith life! Might Easter be a special time for each of us!

#### Between Sundays: The Life in a Seed

It's amazing that a tiny seed, when placed in the dark soil, becomes a thriving plant. We do this simple task with a measure of trust, and it makes all the difference. Every seed is different...different sizes, shapes, and fruit that is produced. In the spring, the displays pop up in stores with all sorts of vegetables, flowers, and plants containing colorful pictures of the final product. The packets are important and not to be discarded because the directions on the back tell of the appropriate depth and spacing for the seeds. The DNA contained in each type of seed requires different directions that are critical to the plant germinating.

The Gospel of John talks about this life after death: "Jesus replied, "The time has come for the Human One to be glorified. I assure you that unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it can only be a single seed. But if it dies, it bears much fruit. (John 12: 23-24, CEB) "The Human One" had to die in order for God to allow us to have eternal life. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, that happens as God plants seeds in our lives. Growing our own faith requires us to plant seeds. The seeds and directions for germination are contained in the text of the Bible. To disregard the guidance and inspiration in the Bible means we miss out on the ways in which we are called to live as a follower of Jesus Christ. It's not enough to read the Bible. Our lives as a follower require more from us. Our faith grows when we allow our old habits to die in the "soil" so that God can sprout new habits in us.

As Holy week approaches, I invite you to examine your life. What habits in you must die so that God can germinate new ones in your life? How hard is it for you to let go of the old habits? Why are you clinging so tightly to those things when they prevent you from getting closer to God? Add into your daily practice this prayer: God of Life, You have placed all we need for life in the shell of a tiny seed. You have also placed all we need for life in the shell of a tiny seed.
