The Bible in Twelve Words

Several years ago I attended a continuing education event at St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Orlando, Florida. One of the highlights of the event was a presentation from the church's lead pastor, the Rev. Bill Barnes, on "The Bible in Twelve Words." I have thought about his presentation over the years, but I had trouble finding my notes. With the current construction project at Lovely Lane, I have been moving items around in my office. With all this activity, I found my notes. I would like to share my learnings.

For Rev. Barnes, the Bible is a "progressive revelation of the nature of God as understood by a particular people" (the Jewish people and those who would identify as Christians). For him, words help people see a progression in Jewish tradition, history, and custom, that culminates in the life and teachings of Jesus.

For Rev. Barnes, the Twelve Words and Themes are . . .

Creation – the book of Genesis starts with two creation stories

Relation – the "Fall" and God's relationship with the Hebrew people

Liberation – the book of Exodus addresses the liberation of the Hebrews

Formation – the latter part of Exodus and the Torah bring holy structure

Confederation – Joshua, Judges, and Ruth address God's providence

Accommodation – likes its neighbors, Israel insists on a king

Deportation – the nations of Israel and Judah are defeated and annexed

Restoration – the Israelites return to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple

Sensation – Psalms, Proverbs, and Ecclesiastes come from the heart

Salvation – the Good News – the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus

Evangelization – Acts and the Letters of Paul spread the church

New Creation – Revelation encourages believers in the First Century world

I hope some of this is helpful for you. I encourage you to turn to the Scriptures for inspiration. This is always a good discipline as we head into the Lenten season this month!

The Zoom Study Group with Pastor Scott is currently studying the book *Philippians* by Cynthia M. Campbell. A new study begins on Feb. 24th that will focus on the book *Embracing the Uncertain* by Magrey R. deVega. This study will follow the Lenten preaching series. All are welcome! Zoom sessions are Wednesdays at 9:30 AM and 7:00 PM.

When I was younger, my dad and I would garden together. It was something we liked to do. Each parsonage we had, we created a big garden in the backyard, where we'd grow watermelon, sweet corn, tomatoes, lettuce, and so much more. We enjoyed gardening together, but it didn't mean we knew a lot about soil maintenance and getting out pesky weeds. Often times, out garden looked more like a backyard jungle than a place to grow vegetables!

When I was in seminary, I had a garden plot at the church. I was able to get back into gardening again, and I learned so much from the master gardeners who tended the soil. Every spring, the soil was turned over, mixing up the rich nutrients in the soil, and I learned you shouldn't consistently plant the same seed in each spot. I even began to compost, knowing how rich compost soil is for the plants.

A few summers ago, my green beans yielded quite an abundance. I frequently gave away lbs. of green beans throughout the summer, until they no longer produced delicious pods. Fire ants had taken over the green beans, and they were slowly dying. While they still produced some green beans, I had to choose to remove what was dying to produce space for new life. In Texas, you actually had multiple growing seasons!

The season of Lent can be quite the place to reflect on our life as we wander in the wilderness for 40 days. As we think about the image of the garden, what in your life do you have to let go of in order for new life to take root? Throughout these 40 days of Lent, I pray it'll be a time to cultivate your soil, learning what nutrients you need to add and what you need to take away. May it be so!

2021 Lenten Special Offering Recipients

Our Missions Committee has picked this year's recipients for our Lent Offering, to be highlighted on 4 upcoming Sundays, as follows:

<u>Matthew 25</u> is a local non-profit that exists to strengthen core neighborhoods on CR's west side. It partners with them to work in 3 program areas: Neighborhood Building, Youth Development and Cultivating Hope. Lovely Lane will partner with Matthew 25 again this year during Transform Week in late June. (Feb. 21, Clint Twedt-Ball, speaker)

<u>Mental Health Access Center</u> provides urgent, high quality crisis behavioral treatment for people 18+ years of age who are experiencing a mental health or substance use crisis in our community. It provides short-term assistance for individuals in crisis and then connects them to on-going recovery services. The goal is to reduce the number of unnecessary hospitalizations and arrests and create a healthier community. (Feb. 28, Amy Guardado, speaker)

<u>JFON</u> is a ministry of hospitality provided by the IA Annual Conference of the UMC. It provides legal services, advocates to bring change in immigration laws and public policy, and strives to educate immigrant communities to better understand their rights and the complex immigration process. (*March 7, Erin Foster, speaker*)

<u>Waypoint's Domestic Violence Victim Services Program</u> (DV Program) offers free, confidential services to domestic violence victims and survivors, as well as their families. It is Cedar Rapids' largest provider of shelter for women and families with children. It also offers child care and education for children ages six weeks to 12 years old daily. (March 14, Autumn Craft, speaker)
