Winter Preparedness Tips from Pastor Cati Newman*

Winter storms can include high winds, snow, rain, freezing rain, thunderstorms, and more. This is a good time to take a few minutes and get prepared for winter weather. Here is a list of tips:

For your Home: 1) Have a plan for how you will keep warm if the power is off for an extended time. DO NOT use the oven or a gas-powered source inside your home. 2) Have fresh batteries, flashlights, or candles in a convenient place. 3) Have some food that does not need to be cooked or heated to eat. 4) Have some water stored in a convenient place. The suggested amount is one gallon per person/animal, per day. 5) Block drafts by rolling up towels and blankets and placing them in front of doors/windows.

For your Vehicle: 1) Keep the gas tank at least half-full all the time. 2) Have an emergency kit in your vehicle that includes extra warm clothing, water, and packaged snacks. 3) If you get stuck or stranded, STAY IN YOUR VEHICLE. You will stay warmer out of the wind and will be easier to find. 4) Let someone know where you are headed, check in with family/friends while traveling long distances.

Other: 1) Check on your neighbors during and after winter storms. 2) Be practical about the amount of time you spend outdoors, be prepared. "It's not the weather that will hurt you...it's not being prepared for the weather."


