### **Sharing the Faith**

The religious landscape of our country continues to evolve. In Pew Research Surveys that took place in 2018 and 2019, 65% of American adults describe themselves as Christian, down 12% over the past decade. At the same time, the religiously unaffiliated (the "nones") share of the population now stands at 26%, up from 17% in 2009.

Reasons abound why these trends are occurring. Some people are turned off by the fighting and feuding within the walls of some denominations and congregations. Others see religious people as hypocritical and self-absorbed. What all this means for me is the church, and other religious bodies, have to keep doing the essential work they are called to do. As Christians, we need to keep going back to the words of Jesus in Matthew 28:19 (CEB), "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations . . . ."

Our Discipleship Pathway at Lovely Lane continues to provide guidance in the disciple-making process. We continue to focus on "Worship + 2." We need to make a commitment to regular worship (online or in-person, when the timing is right). We also need to participate in a group that deepens our spiritual life and we need to serve others in a way that brings out our gifts and talents. As we grow as disciples, we have the capacity to impact others.

An additional consideration is the simple steps, or everyday practices, that can make a big difference:

- Mention your church in casual conversation. Talk about Lovely Lane to others. Be proud of your local church.
- Say "grace" at meals, anywhere and everywhere. Others might follow.
- Be careful with your language. Avoid saying "good luck." Say, "peace" or "blessings." Use words that reflect your faith.
- Do one or two random acts of kindness each week. This becomes contagious.
- Intentionally pray for a particular person, or persons, outside your normal circle.

Together, we can make a difference in the lives of others and share the faith. Might we commit to some extra steps we can take in the New Year!

FAITH ISSUES DISCUSSION OF WHITE FRAGILITY: On Jan. 17, 24 and 31st, beginning at 9 AM, the Faith Issues Class will be discussing the book White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism. This book, written by Robin DiAngelo, addresses an important issue of our day. DiAngelo is an author and lecturer who has also been a consultant and trainer on issues of racism and social justice for over 20 years. One of the church goals set by the Administrative Council for 2021 is to "Address important social issues that need attention." The church needs to create settings in which matters like racism, white supremacy, LGBTQ acceptance, and the welcoming of refugees and immigrants can be talked about and learning and action can take place."

The first week, Jo Hoover will facilitate a conversation centering around our experiences with people of color. The next two weeks, Rose Blank will lead a discussion based on DiAngelo's book. Along with sharing background information on racism, DiAngelo probes some difficult areas and triggers for us as we deal with these issues surrounding race and white privilege. She also provides "Where do we go from here?" as a way to continue the conversations that move

The backpack food program has been a collaboration between HACAP, Pierce Elementary, and Lovely Lane UMC for many years. Lovely Lane has provided leadership, financial resources, donations from local food manufacturers, and dedicated weekly volunteers who pick up, pack, and deliver food bags to Pierce students. This program is crucial for families that struggle with food scarcity.

As with many things this year, the pandemic has required us all to make adjustments. This year, in order to limit exposures and remain healthy and safe, Pierce Elementary will work directly with HACAP to supply nutritious food bags to our students.

### Additional Building Renovations in 2021

As the new year begins, we are leveraging the momentum gained in 2020 to complete Phase 1 of our renovation plan with the following improvements:

Foyer, Narthex, Fireside and Sanctuary - LED lighting, ceiling tiles, pew restoration, flooring, furnishings, paint, organ bulkhead removal with new A/V console, electrical upgrades, HVAC unit replacement, glass entry to Sanctuary and door entry to Fireside for sound reduction

Main bathrooms - ADA accessible, replace cast iron plumbing with plastic

Building security - access controls and exterior cameras

Fellowship Hall - general repairs, durable flooring, paint and furnishings

HVAC replacement - replace two failing units in basement that serve west side of building

Work is scheduled to begin in January and end in June. The cost to complete this work is nearly \$700,000 and will be paid for through fulfilled pledges to the capital campaign and a loan through the Iowa United Methodist Foundation.

Please continue to fulfill your pledge to the campaign and prayerfully consider how you can further our progress. Your kind and generous spirit is appreciated!


