A Thorny Matter

A woman goes on a dream vacation, yet she can't let go of a work matter that is getting the best of her. A man pays off some debt, but there is still a specific burden that needs attention. A couple resolves some family issues, but a particular situation remains. There is frequently that "one thing" that gets the best of us and won't go away.

We tend to call these things "thorns." Thorns are not fun. Ever get a thorn in your finger? It is hard to get it out and it can lead to bruising or bleeding. Thorns can easily bring us down. Thorns include the difficulties just listed. Yet a complete list can include every complication under the sun, including physical ailments, sinful thoughts, and bad habits. There are always matters that push us to the limit.

The Apostle Paul once spoke about a "thorn in the flesh." Commentators have tried for years to discern the precise nature of the thorn. St. John Chrysostom (347-407 AD) said the thorn represented the "enemies of the gospel." The thorn could have been a temptation or even an individual like the Alexander the metalworker, who brought Paul "a great deal of harm." (2 Timothy 4:14, NIV)

Now we may not know much about Paul's thorn, but the apostle tells us the purpose of the thorn is to keep him humble. In 2 Corinthians 12:7 he writes, "To keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassing great revelations, there was given me a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me."

No one likes to endure extra challenges. Paul asked the Lord to remove the source of pain. He probably thought removing the pain would make his ministry better or allow him to reach more people for Christ. Yet it appears the Lord was more concerned with building Paul's character.

Instead of taking away the issue at hand, God allowed the thorn to remain. Additionally, God gave Paul the strength to handle the situation. Strength is gained from weakness.

This is a lesson for each of us to ponder during this Lenten Season and beyond. Through struggles and temptations, we learn to rely on the Lord. We need our mighty God. This can make us a better person and disciple!

Have you ever been in a hurry to get somewhere, and then suddenly you hear those dreaded sounds, sirens behind you as you were driving a tad bit too fast in your haste? Maybe you've looked all over your house, but you just can't find your car keys, or you left your phone in a hidden place, on silent and can't find it anywhere? I've certainly done these things, and it never feels good! As I'm writing this month's newsletter article, I'm sitting at the Toyota Dealership, waiting for Ryan's car to get checked out in anticipation of the diagnosis and cost of repair, something we certainly didn't anticipate this week.

These unexpected frustrations can really test our patience and certainly throw off our daily routine. I've found that when I'm sitting at a red light, a light that turns red when I'm in a hurry, what helps is turning to God in prayer. I come back to breath prayer. Breath prayer is an ancient form of prayer that is easily adaptable for whatever works for you for your situation. Simply choose one or two lines to meditate on and inhale and exhale thru them.

An example might be:

Inhale: Be Still Exhale: and know you are God.

Or

Inhale: I find rest *Exhale:* in Your shelter.

Next time you're feeling frustrated and anxious, try out breath prayer and see how God restores your soul.

2021 Lenten Special Offering Recipients

Our Missions Committee picked this year's recipients for our Lenten Offering, each highlighted on 1 of 4 Sundays, as follows:

<u>Matthew 25</u> is a local non-profit that exists to strengthen core neighborhoods on CR's west side. It partners with them to work in 3 program areas: Neighborhood Building, Youth Development and Cultivating Hope. Lovely Lane will partner with Matthew 25 again this year during Transform Week in late June. (Feb. 21, Clint Twedt-Ball, speaker)

<u>JFON</u> is a ministry of hospitality provided by the IA Annual Conference of the UMC. It provides legal services, advocates to bring change in immigration laws and public policy, and strives to educate immigrant communities to better understand their rights and the complex immigration process. (Feb. 28, Amy Guardado, speaker)

<u>Mental Health Access Center</u> provides urgent, high quality crisis behavioral treatment for people 18+ years of age who are experiencing a mental health or substance use crisis in our community. It provides short-term assistance for individuals in crisis and then connects them to on-going recovery services. The goal is to reduce the number of unnecessary hospitalizations and arrests and create a healthier community. (*March 7, Erin Foster, speaker*)

<u>Waypoint's Domestic Violence Victim Services Program</u> (DV Program) offers free, confidential services to domestic violence victims and survivors, as well as their families. It is Cedar Rapids' largest provider of shelter for women and families with children. It also offers child care and education for children ages six weeks to 12 years old daily. IOWA UNITED METHODIST CAMPS LAUNCH ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

Okoboji and Wesley Woods United Methodist Camps are excited to launch their second annual campaign in preparation for offering youth programs on-site in summer 2021.

Director of Camps and Retreats, Bryan Johnson, views youth camping as a way to support youth and the future of United Methodism. "The sustainability of any church relies upon developing and growing the Christian faith in as many as possible. In that vein, Iowa United Methodist camps are proud to be places where Christ is introduced to young people."

Financial subsidy for Iowa UM Camps has come through the Iowa Apportionment System for decades until recently when changes to the apportionment system have required the camping ministry in Iowa to identify new sources of support.

While 2020 on-site summer plans altered because of COVID-19, the intention is to have normal programs offered this summer with revised protocols to allow for the safest possible environment. This year, the campaign has set a goal of \$200,000 of support.

"While some would see decreased apportionment funding as a bad thing, we see it as a tremendous opportunity to work directly with the tens of thousands of people who have had positive faith experiences at an Iowa United Methodist Camp," said Johnson. "We have an awesome opportunity to engage our alumni and supporters who understand the powerful experiences that camp provides."
