Rejoice Always

Frantic! Frantic! Does this describe your life? Do you have a lot on your plate? Are you busy keeping up with work and family matters? We can all relate to busy schedules.

Now one obvious concern in all this busyness is that we lose sight of what is most important. When we get so caught up in everything going on, we miss out on time with those we love and we fail to embrace the celebrations in front of us. We take our eyes off the Lord.

St. Paul, in Philippians 4, gives us a formula for getting our life in order. Paul writes, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:4,6 NIV)

Paul gives tremendous insight on finding peace in the midst of a hectic life. Let's consider a couple of suggestions the apostle lifts up. For starters, we look at the command to "Rejoice in the Lord always." Consider that Paul is writing from prison, essentially death row. He is in chains, waiting to find out if he will be sentenced to death. At first glance, it is amazing he can find joy.

It is obvious for Paul that joy does not mean everything is going our way. Joy comes from an inner assurance that whatever we are going through, God is with us. Happiness depends on happenings. Joy is a confidence that God is always there. I love the words of Henri Nouwen, "Joy does not simply happen to us. We have to choose joy and keep choosing it every day." In choosing joy over happiness, we have the power to find something good in everything going on.

Following a call to rejoice then, Paul provides another profound insight. He writes, "Do not be anxious about anything but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Paul had learned the power of gratitude. When we are grateful, we gain a new outlook on life.

Matthew Henry, the famous Bible scholar, was once stopped by thieves and robbed of his purse. He wrote in his diary, "First, let me be thankful I was never robbed before; second, my life was not taken; third, they didn't take everything; fourth, it was I who was robbed and not somebody else."

Can you find ways to be grateful? Try giving thanks and expressing an attitude of gratitude. Remember to also focus on joy over happiness and count our blessings. St. Paul shows the way! A Thousand Blessings! Scott

United Methodist Judicial Council Ruling

The Judicial Council of the United Methodist Church met on April 23-26 to review action taken at the recent General Conference. The Council concluded that some parts of the Traditional Plan are unconstitutional, while the rest is constitutional. Some of the main rulings are:

- As approved in Feb., clergy who perform same-sex weddings will be required to take a one-year involuntary leave of absence without pay. If they officiate at subsequent same-sex weddings, their clergy credentials will be removed.
- Boards of Ordained Ministry will be required to examine and not recommend candidates who don't meet standards regarding human sexuality.
- An exit strategy was approved for local churches wanting to leave the denomination.

Conversations with denominational leaders are taking place in the coming months in Kansas City and Minneapolis about possible next steps for congregations not happy with the recent rulings. Also, General Conference 2020 takes place next year. Many of the rulings and matters at hand have the potential to be reviewed and voted on again.

Please remember LGBTQ+ members and friends will always be included in the full membership and life of Lovely Lane. God loves all!



CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

A lot has been happening over the last couple of months to continue pressing forward with the capital campaign and improvements to our church building.

But first, THANK YOU to all who have contributed to this effort! We are all truly, **Blessed to be a Blessing!** The total amount pledged/received to date will be announced to the congregation during a worship service in May. While we have not fully met our audacious \$2.85M goal, the total is one we can be very proud of -- as it's believed to be the largest amount pledged to a project in the history of our church!

Some of you have also reached out to me to let me know that you still plan to make a gift, but have not yet done so. Please know that the right time to make a gift is whenever you are ready -- both financially and in your heart. In March and April, the pastors and campaign leaders met with Dr. Katharine Yarnell, Director of the Iowa United Methodist Foundation (IUMF - www.iumf.org), to discuss our campaign, plans and needs. The IUMF provides a variety of financial services to Iowa United Methodist Churches and individual church members. The most eye-opening news from this meeting was learning of the ability for church members to easily give gifts of stocks and property, a process the Foundation will assist with for free! We invited Dr. Yarnell to present two workshops at Lovely Lane, which took place in early April. There, we learned about the many ways to give other than cash, as well as the giving strategies for different stages of our financial lives, and several methods to leave gifts to the church in a will. Please contact us if you'd like to learn more.

The Steering Committee has formed and began meeting in April. This team formation was a requirement of the motion passed at the Oct. 28 '18 church meeting. (Go to www.llblessing.org and search for steering committee to review the details of the motion passed in October). Matt Mulnik is leading this team, which was commissioned at a worship service in April. In a nutshell, this team is reviewing the gifts that have been pledged and provided, researching other funding, and comparing the resources to the planned work to determine the best next steps. This team will present the congregation with their findings and recommendations in the coming months, as we move forward with our architects to make improvements to our building that will enhance our mission and ministry.

There is much more to come, but Lovely Lane's future can only be described as exciting! May we continue to be **Blessed to be a Blessing** as we work to share God's love and hope with others.

Life Between Sundays: Creation Care

Earth Day comes around every year on April 21st. There is always a big push intended to spark people into action. Yet, as people of God, we are called to care for creation 365 days a year out of a place of love. God calls us to love as Jesus loved: Love God, love neighbor, love the creation that is around us. We can do this best when we assess our own practices and make some changes. Plastic is one of the most harmful things for the environment, especially because it ends up on our waterways and brings harm to water life. So many of the plastic items we use were created to make life easier for us. The trouble is that these items are costly to manufacture, damage the environment, and are intended for just ONE use.

I invite you to make at least ONE change in your life that will have a positive impact on the environment. Below is list of "single use items" that you might choose from, and the alternative item to use. This is intended to be a starting place for you that will lead to the healing of our very sick planet. If we each make just ONE change, we will start to make a difference.

Single Use Items / What to Use/Do Instead

(Get in the habit of carrying these items in your car or work bag each day!)

Plastic straws / Reusable metal or BPA free plastic straws

Plastic water bottles / Refillable water bottle

Disposable Coffee Cups with lids / Reusable travel mugs

Plastic grocery sacks / Reusable cloth bags

Plastic/styrofoam take-out containers / Glass or stainless steel container

Plastic wrap / Waxed cloth or silicone covers

Plastic cutlery / Metal cutlery

Six pack soda rings / Buy pop in 2 L bottles or in boxes

Plastic party cups & supplies / Use regular dishes & party supplies

Single serve Keurig coffee pods / Refillable coffee pods

Produce bags / Reusable fabric or mesh bags
