Iowa Annual Conference Update

As some of you know, the Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church held a special session on May 23rd. This was a session to allow 83 United Methodist churches in Iowa to disaffiliate and begin a new denomination. This is about 11% of the UM churches in our state. Many of these churches are moving to a new denomination called the Global Methodist Church. This denomination will have more conservative theological leanings that are not open to the ordination of LGBTQ clergy and same-gender weddings.

All of this is sad, but it has been a long-time coming. Members of our conference and denomination have had different views on the Bible and LGBTQ matters for some time. I wish we remained together, but I also understand the need to move forward. I have friends on the other side and I appreciate my conversations with those folks, but sometimes a divorce is necessary. Our unity has been challenged, but I think this makes us even more determined to show fresh ways of a unified spirit.

Lovely Lane has had a welcoming presence throughout our church's history. The Welcoming Statement in our bulletin has been in place for over twenty years. The CAT Survey we took last year confirmed our theological leanings. The survey revealed that 70% of our congregation agrees with the ordination of LGBTQ clergy and the performing of same-gender weddings in our sanctuary. At Lovely Lane, we will continue to be faithful to our covenant and commitment to the current Iowa Annual Conference.

I will add that all the UM churches in Cedar Rapids are remaining committed to the Iowa Annual Conference too. In fact, we are going to have a joint worship service on Sunday, July 2nd, at Coe College. This will a time to celebrate the common work and ministry we do!

I will keep in touch with any further developments. I am also open to any questions you might have.

Seeing God in Story Books

This past week I spent a week off to spend time with Audrey as daycare takes a 2-week break, in between the school year and the summer program. We played outside, went on walks, went to the infant story hour at the new Marion Public Library, read books at home in the living room, and any other activity I created on the spot!

The Runaway Bunny by Margaret Wise Brown is a classic storybook. Released in 1942, the book shares about a bunny and his mother. The bunny is constantly trying to get away from the mom. He runs away, but then his mother says she will run after him. So the little bunny says, "If you run after me, I will become a fish and swim away from you." To that the mother says, "I will become a fisherman, and I will fish for you." Little bunny becomes a fish, a rock on a mountain, crocus in a hidden garden, a bird, a sailboat, a circus acrobat, and finally a little boy. Mother bunny consistently keeps coming after him, appearing as a fisherman, a mountain climber, a gardener, a tree, a cloud, a trapeze walker, and finally as a mother herself. She never tires from searching after little bunny. And of course the book touches at your heart strings when it ends with these words, ""I will become a little boy and run into a house." "If you become a little boy and run into a house, I will become your mother and catch you in my arms and hug you.""

As I was reading this book to Audrey, I couldn't help but see the connections to our faith. Isn't God a lot like the mother bunny? God constantly searches after the lost one, the lost sheep, the lost son, etc. And God will keep searching for us when we've run away, appearing before us in whatever form we need. God never tires from seeking us out, and that brings me a lot of comfort. God is always there to catch you in God's arms and embrace you, just like the mother and her little bunny. So, as I finished reading this book with Audrey, I brought her in tight in my arms, gave her a big bear hug, and showered her with kisses. Someday she'll be embarrassed by that, but for now I'll embrace every minute of it! Peace, Pastor Kristima

If you've made a silent, directed retreat, we welcome you back. If you've never made a retreat like this, we invite you to consider this question: *What's the deepest silence you've ever known?* Silent Directed Retreats offer opportunities to enter into deep silence in order to sense what it feels like to awaken a quiet and palpable connection and deepen your relationship with the Source of All being.

Each day you will receive ongoing direction as you and a professionally-trained spiritual director listen intentionally to the movement of the Source of All Being in your heart. Listening in such profound silence assists you to get in touch with feelings, thoughts and actions as you reflect, meditate, pray and rest. The practice of this daily meeting assists in developing the capacity to discern, notice, sense the movement of the Source of All Being in light of your motivations, attachments, responses to that movement within the whole of your life. To share with a professional your divine experiences brings clarity, deepens your commitment and accountability to the direction of your life, surprises and offers insight into that direction.

At Prairiewoods, we try to hold any outside stimulation to a minimum so that everything—the silence, solitude, reflective activity, meals, etc.—supports your unique needs. A daily meditation/centering is offered. Optional reflective activities such as artwork, yoga and singing bowl meditation are available throughout the week. Even meals are eaten reflectively in silence.

Each day supports your individual needs. Stroll woods and prairie. Sense sunset quietly turn to dusk. Journal, if you choose. Nap. Engage in yoga, art expression, meditation. Notice how food nourishes our capacity for silence. Explore holding the silence with a group of others: humans, stone, tree, pond, squirrel, deer, turkey, star, moon, dawn, dusk ...

Is the silence simply the absence of noise? Or is it also a presence unto itself? See for yourself! Come re-establish and remember the deep connection we share with all of the creation as we listen together to the great silence. 
