Reading the Bible

"I will instruct you and teach you about the direction you should go. I'll advise you and keep my eye on you." – Psalm 32:8 (CEB)

The summer months are a wonderful time to go deeper into the biblical word. I encourage each of you to read the Bible on a regular basis. This is an important part of our devotional life.

If you are interested in reading the Bible in a methodical manner, I recommend you read the Gospel of Mark first, then move to Matthew, Luke, and John. The rest of the New Testament can follow. After the reading the entire New Testament, you might move to the Old Testament. If you try to read the Old Testament first, it's possible you will lose interest after the opening books. Mark's Gospel is a good starting point. It only has 16 chapters. There is urgency in the writing. It's a nice place to begin.

If you prefer to read Bible passages a bit randomly, I encourage you to gain an understanding of the context. You might read a particular passage in at least a couple of translations (such as the CEB, NIV, or *The Message*). After this, read the chapter before and the chapter after the passage. This gives some insights into the context. It's critical to know the particular setting and situation. Harm is done when the proper context is not understood.

As you read any passage in the Bible, methodically or randomly, you might ask yourself a few questions, such as "What?" "So What?" and "Now What?" It's important to ponder what happened all those years ago. Beyond this, ask yourself what this passage means for you today in our current world. Finally, ponder what you can do to put your understanding of the Bible into action. A deeper biblical faith should lead to actions that make a difference in the lives others.

It is a joy to read the Bible. Might this discipline become a regular part of your life and journey! Happy reading!

Will You Pray For Us?

In just a few short weeks, several of us from Lovely Lane are piling into large ten passenger vans to travel down to the U.S.-Mexico border where we'll spend time learning, listening, and seeing the experience at the border. We leave on July 8th early in the morning and return on July 16th. We have three high school students and five adults going on this trip. This will be a challenging experience for many, and they will encounter things they have never seen before. We will spend some time in Dallas, TX, worshipping with a diverse Latino faith community and spend time in conversation with ethics professor Dr. Hugo Magallanes, a favorite seminary professor of mine. Then we will travel down to Brownsville, TX, a border town where we'll experience a court hearing on immigration, see what is happening at the border, and go to organizations that are working with those seeking asylum and refugees. Of course, we'll go to the beach down in Texas, but truly, we are going to grow. We're going to be challenged, so will you pray for us? Will you pray for the eight of us going on this trip? Will you pray that we are open to the Spirit? Will you pray for our safety? Will you pray that we encounter ourselves in the lives of others that we will meet? And will you pray for us, that we encounter Christ in the eyes of the stranger, in the eyes of the refugee? Prioritize Your Mental Health This Summer

Many of us have been eagerly anticipating the season of summer, possibly for a lighter work load and/or for some extra time off—to go on vacation or to have a stay-at-home vacation to accomplish some planned projects.

Unfortunately, mental health challenges don't take a summer break, and feelings of anxiety i can even increase as temperatures rise. We encourage all First Aiders to prioritize self-care this summer so you can continue to #BeTheDifference for the people in your life.

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) recognizes that there is a serious mental health crisis in the U.S. A recent survey conducted by the Harris Poll on behalf of the National Council for Mental Wellbeing shows that a staggering 43% of U.S. adults who needed substance use or mental health care in the past 12 months say they did not receive that care, and numerous barriers to access stand between them and needed treatment. That's why it's more important than ever for you to continue promoting mental wellbeing in your communities.

In honor of LGBTQ# and PTSD Awareness Month in June, consider becoming a MHFA instructor or encouraging your friends and family to get certified in MHFA to foster deeper understanding and destigmatize mental health challenges. Just as CPR helps you assist an individual having a heart attack, MHFA helps you assist someone experiencing a mental health or substance-use-related challenge or crisis. You'll learn risk factors and warning signs for mental health and substance use challenges, strategies for how to help someone in crisis and non-crisis situations and where to turn for help.

! Together, we can make mental wellbeing, including recovery from substance abuse, a reality ! for everyone.


