Starting a New Year!

"Only say what is helpful when it is needed for building up the community..." Ephesians 4:29 (CEB)

We are moving into a New Year! Believe it or not, 2024 is now upon us. There is so much to look forward to. There are also things to leave behind!

For starters, we might consider leaving behind **Spite**. Spite is a desire to hurt or offend someone. Author, Isabel Wilkerson, once said, "Spite does not pay. It goes around and misses the object that you aim and come backs and gets you." Spite is not a pleasant way to go. It can show how small we can be. With spite, we decide to make someone look bad. We use social media and whatever measures we have at our disposal. We might say we are doing something on principle, but many times it is spite. Let's consider leaving behind spite in the New Year.

Beyond spite, let's contemplate leaving behind **Cynicism**. A cynical person has negative opinions about other people. They believe that people only do what they do for their own self-interest. They see the cup half empty instead of seeing the cup half full. They are negative. Instead of being cynical, might we listen to others! Might we consider what others have to say to us! There might be a very good reason people do what they do. Taking the negative side on an issue is never a pretty way to go.

Finally, might we ponder leaving behind **Sarcasm**! Sarcasm is using irony to communicate the opposite of the surface meaning. The intention is often a desire to use humor to mock someone. Legendary comedian Don Rickles made a career of being sarcastic. The characters, Chandler Bing (the late Matthew Perry), on Friends, and Charlie Harper, on Two and Half Men, were known for their sarcasm. We could laugh at them, but in real life this way of life gets tired. Our aim in life should be a desire to build up others not tear them down. Might we lay aside sarcasm in the New Year!

Moving forward, there is so much good we can do. Let us build up those around us!



The Wesley Covenant Prayer

At the beginning of the new year, congregations in the Wesleyan/Methodist family renew their covenant with God using the traditional Covenant Prayer (below). John Wesley adapted this prayer from the Puritan tradition that was so important to his parents, Samuel and Susannah, and life in the Epworth rectory. It informed his theology and preaching. He expected the people called "Methodists" to pray this prayer at the beginning of each new year as a way of remembering and renewing their baptismal covenant. The prayer describes the life of a participant with Christ in mission. The prayer helps us remember what a Jesus-way of life looks like. (Rev. "I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

Friendly Fellowship will meet on Thursday, January 25th, at noon for a potluck lunch and program. The program will be presented by Sergeant Nathan Trimble from the Cedar Rapids Police Department. He is the head of the KP Unit and will tell us about this program, bringing some of the dogs.

The Cedar Rapids Police Department has seven K9 teams, including six narcotics dogs and a bomb/explosives dog. All the teams are assigned to the Community Services Division and are supervised by Patrol Sergeant Nathan Trimble. They are available seven days a week, providing around the clock service to the community, as a K9 team is assigned to every shift. There is one Dutch Shepherd and six Belgian Malinois on the Department. When not on-duty, the dogs live with their handlers as family pets.
