Cuba Partnership Trip

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations"- Matthew 28:19 (NRSV)

As the new month begins I am in Havana, Cuba, with a small group of Lovely Laners. We are traveling with a group of folks from the Plymouth Congregational Church in Des Moines. Our group totals eleven in number. We arrive back in the United States on February 6.

The purpose of the trip is threefold. For starters, we are learning what it's like to have a partner congregation in Cuba. The Plymouth Church has a sister relationship with the Ebenezer Baptist Church. We are witnessing both churches come together and interact. The donations you have graciously brought to the church have been given to members of the Ebenezer Church to distribute as needed. We hope to have our own partner church coming up.

Secondarily, we are learning about the history and culture of Cuba. As many of you know, the United States has a long-storied history with Cuba. Beginning with Christopher Columbus coming to Cuba in 1492, and continuing with the American Revolution in the late 1700's, the Cuban War of Independence in 1898, the Bay of Pigs and the Cuban Missile Crisis in the 1960's, as well as the rule of Fidel Castro, Cuba has had an interesting relationship with the United States. We are anxious to learn more about this history.

Finally, in going to Cuba, we hope to have a better understanding of the beauty of diversity. We are experiencing a country that is different than the United States in many ways in regards to politics, language, and the economy. We are also experiencing a church, the Ebenezer Church, which does church differently than we do at Lovely Lane. We are looking to have a better grasp on the beauty of diversity.

I truly believe diversity is a gift from God. We need to listen, learn, and love one another. From what I have seen in my life, nothing else works but accepting diversity. Every other approach ends in injustice and some form of tragedy. Throughout his ministry, Jesus demonstrated the need to embrace folks who were different than he was. We hope to do the same. Our group looks forward to sharing our stories coming up. Please keep us in your prayers. Blessings, Pastor Scott

Matthew 25: Is a local non-profit that exists to strengthen core urban neighborhoods in Cedar Rapids. They build strong neighborhoods by focusing on fresh, healthy food; affordable, sustainable housing, and education. Projects include the state's first urban farm, school gardens, youth job training, a tool library, Groundswell "pay-it-forward" Café, and a variety of housing programs. Transform, the annual volunteer housing rehabilitation blitz, brings more than three hundred volunteers together the final full week of June.

Trinity Lane PreSchool Scholarships: Trinity Lane is a state-licensed, non-profit preschool. In 2022, Trinity Lane's new home was opened in Asbury United Methodist Church. The preschool includes classrooms for 2, 3, and 4 year olds. The 4 year old program is FREE in partnership with Cedar Rapids and the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program. The 2 and 3 year old programs are tuition based. Sliding Scale Scholarships are available to those who qualify. Your generous contributions will allow more lower income families to participate in this much needed early education opportunity.

Self Help International: Is an independent, nongovernmental 501(c)(3), established in 1959. It is dedicated to preventing hunger in rural communities in Ghana, West Africa, Nicaragua, and Central America. It operates on the principle that people everywhere have talents and resources they can use, with help, to improve their lives. This approach was created with input from United Methodists, and has been supported generously by United Methodists over many years. Self-Help offers assistance through agricultural extension, nutritional education, micro-credit, empowerment of women, development of small business, storage of farm products, and other related programs.

Be the Light: Their mission is to bring together individuals and communities affected by mental health and suicide through a glow walk event. By shining a light on hope and healing, they strive to create a safe and supportive environment where participants can connect, support each other, and find strength in solidarity. Together, the aim to make a positive impact on our communities and help those in need.
