The Final Week

"The spirit is willing, but the body is weak." – Matthew 26:41b (NIV)

Each of our four Gospels tells the story of Jesus a little bit differently, however, there is a common understanding about the general events during the final week of Jesus's life. Following an emotional day that we will eventually know as "Palm Sunday," a tumultuous week took place. The mood will change from "Good News to Bad News."

As the crowds left Jesus on Palm Sunday, word began to spread that Jesus of Nazareth was in Jerusalem for the Passover Festival. A series of events will bring Jesus to the cross and Golgotha. The first event involved Jesus overturning tables in the Temple. He told those buying and selling goods to "stop making my father's house a place of business."

As the week moved along, at noon, on Thursday, Jesus turned to two of his disciples and told them to go into town and prepare the Passover feast, or Seder, in which he and the disciples will eat in private. At approximately 7:00 that evening then, Jesus and the other disciples joined Peter and John in the Upper Room for the meal. That night Jesus identified the betrayer, Judas, and spoke about his upcoming death.

Following the Upper Room meal, Jesus and the disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane. Here, Jesus prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. Jesus hoped to avoid trouble, but he knew it was coming. In rapid-fire fashion then, Judas will point out Jesus to the religious authorities and Jesus will get arrested. Bound hand and foot like a criminal, he went before the Sanhedrin, the Jewish Ruling Council, and he was labeled as "guilty" for his belief that he is the Son of God.

As the sun came up on the day we know as Good Friday, Jesus will go before Pontius Pilate. He will later carry a cross to Golgotha where he will speak his final words and have his last breath. This was a challenging week for Jesus, but of course, "Bad News" did not win that day. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead. In a sense then, the mood shifted once more from "Bad News to Good News."

We look forward to sharing this story of "Good News, Bad News, Good News" with each of you. This story never gets old and it's life-changing. We hope you can join us for worship this month! Grace and peace, Pastor Scott

We are in the midst of our Lenten season as we enter into the season of Spring and the fast-approaching month of April. Throughout our Lenten series in the Nourished community, we have been reflecting on themes in "The Risk of Being Woke" by Curtiss Paul DeYoung. This past Centering, we looked at the idea of "being," and remaining centered in our spiritual practices.

Studies show that when we are in crisis, the first three things to go are eating well, exercising, and sleeping, all things that help us to thrive. As we reflected on "being," we looked to some thoughts about survival that my husband Ryan put together for a previous sermon at St. Paul's.

When we are in a place of crisis, one of the best things we can do is to begin with what is possible, especially when everything feels impossible! Ask yourself, "What is something that is simple or doable or possible that I CAN do in these circumstances?" Maybe this is prayer. Maybe it's taking a nap or eating some food. Maybe this is as simple as taking a deep breath at every stop light on your commute to work.

The second thing we can do is to care for our inner life and ground ourselves in something beyond us. For those of us in the Christian faith tradition, God is essential in grounding ourselves and remaining open to the possibilities. We need to take care of our inner life, our body, mind, and spirit, when we're in crisis. We might take the time to see a therapist, a spiritual director, an accountability group, or maybe even a prayer group.

The third thing that my husband lifted up is to practice because practice creates resiliency. And when we're talking about practice, it's to practice our spiritual disciplines. We practice spiritual disciplines because they help us navigate a crisis or conflict when they arise. Spiritual disciplines can be different for every person- meditation, yoga, movement, prayer, reading, journaling, etc.

Lately it's felt like everything is turning on its head and it can leave us feeling like nothing is possible. Use these three things to help ground you in something greater.

Notes from March Event

On Saturday, March 15, Lovely Lane UWF sponsored a workshop on Labor Trafficking. We discussed that many products coming from other countries are made with slave labor. Buying *Made in USA* or *Fair-trade* items guarantee that there is no slavery in the supply chain. The two products and the components that are imported which most often used slave labor are chocolate and coffee. Children are often used in the supply chain to pick cocoa beans and coffee beans. Slave labor is often involved with clothing that is made and diamonds that are mined.

2025 Lenten Offering Recipients

Matthew 25 - Is a local non-profit that exists to strengthen core urban neighborhoods in Cedar Rapids. They build strong neighborhoods by focusing on fresh, healthy food; affordable, sustainable housing, and education. Projects include the state's first urban farm, school gardens, youth job training, a tool library, Groundswell "pay-it-forward" Café, and a variety of housing programs. Transform, the annual volunteer housing rehabilitation blitz, brings more than three hundred volunteers together the final full week of June.

Trinity Lane PreSchool Scholarships - Trinity Lane is a state-licensed, non-profit preschool. In 2022, Trinity Lane's new home was opened in Asbury United Methodist Church. The preschool includes classrooms for 2-, 3-, and 4-year-olds. The 4-year-old program is FREE in partnership with Cedar Rapids and the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program. The 2- and 3-year-old programs are tuition based. Sliding Scale Scholarships are available to those who qualify. Your generous contributions will allow more lower income families to participate in this much-needed early education opportunity.

Self Help International - Is an independent, non-governmental 501(c)(3), established in 1959. It is dedicated to preventing hunger in rural communities in Ghana, West Africa, Nicaragua, and Central America. It operates on the principle that people everywhere have talents and resources they can use, with help, to improve their lives. This approach was created with input from United Methodists and has been supported generously by United Methodists over many years. Self-Help offers helps through agricultural extension, nutritional education, micro-credit, empowerment of women, development of small business, storage of farm products, and other related programs.

Be the Light - Iowa - Their mission is to bring together individuals and communities affected by mental health and suicide through a glow walk event. By shining a light on hope and healing, they strive to create a safe and supportive environment where participants can connect, support each other, and find strength in solidarity. Together, the aim to make a positive impact on our communities and help those in need.
