A Matter of Trust

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding."

Proverbs 3:5 (NIV)

The *National Review* ran a story the day after Memorial Day that was titled, "'Mission: Impossible – The Final Reckoning,' In Cruise We Trust." The article brought out the belief that a new movie from Tom Cruise can boost the box office just as his character, Ethan Hunt, can save the day and make our world safer. It's nice to have those we can turn to and trust.

Now this headline was written in a tongue-in-cheek manner, but I think it's true that we put our trust in others. We like to believe that others will come through for us. In his book, *Talking to Strangers*, Malcolm Gladwell writes about the ways we "default to truth." We like to believe that others are trustworthy. We want to believe the best about others. Even when someone is doing something that looks suspicious we want to believe that individual is up to something good, not something bad. If we didn't default to truth, then we would never trust someone.

Trust is often defined as the belief that someone is reliable and will behave in a way we expect. This belief is foundational in the key relationships in our lives, whether they are family, church, community, or work. It is often said that "once trust is broken, it can take a long time to heal." That's how important this quality is!

Trust is found in the Bible. The ancient Israelites put their trust in Moses that he would lead them out of Egypt and bring them into the Promised Land. Jesus put his trust in the disciples and they returned that firm belief. The apostle, Paul, had a firm conviction that others would welcome him as he travelled great distances to spread the Gospel.

Of course, it's easy to trust people when times are good. The challenges come when times are difficult. While we don't want to lose faith in others, we want to put our ultimate trust in God. Trusting God means that we surrender to the Great Almighty. It means that while we may not comprehend what is taking place around us, we know that God is present.

In May, our major event was presented by Chains Interrupted, an organization in Cedar Rapids that works to educate youth and adults to prevent Sex Trafficking. Some important points from the presentation:

- Sex Trafficking happens in Iowa!
- Contacts most often occur via computer apps such as TikTok
- 50% of Sex Trafficking is within the family with mothers and fathers pimping out their children, spouses and significant others.

We must be vigilant and do whatever we can. Two women in United Women of Faith have now been trained as speakers and are already scheduling events. The first event is in Independence on **June 5**.

“You Can Make A Difference”

“You can make a difference.” I’ve heard that phrase a lot throughout my life, and I’ve often wondered if I truly can make a difference as just one person. I’ve never gotten involved in legislative change in either the United Methodist Church or on a political level. I’ve been timid, maybe a little scared, but I’ve also thought whether I could even move the needle for change.

In the fall of 2023, I began to get involved with a group of young United Methodists who were beginning to work on some legislative ideas for creating a more robust parental leave policy for clergy in the United Methodist Church. This work began after Bishop Carcaño’s trial in September 2023, in the California-Nevada Conference, which included some challenges for a clergywoman’s maternity leave. Over the course of these last few years of Zoom meetings and heavy theological and political work, a proposed legislation has been written and put together to propose to United Methodist Conferences across the denomination to increase parental leave for clergy to thirteen weeks, which includes live birth, adoption, and foster care (which had not previously been recognized). I’ve been working on this for a few years now, attending Zoom meetings across the connection and working to propose this policy in the Iowa United Methodist Church for this year’s Annual Conference held in Des Moines on June 13-15. I’m nervous and excited to see where things land on the voting floor at Annual Conference this year. I’m now serving a term on The Commission on the Status and Role of Women from my work on this legislative proposal. (COSROW works for the full inclusion of women in the life of the United Methodist Church.) Our team at COSROW welcomes your prayers as this important proposal will be voted on at Annual Conference this year.

I’ve never done anything like this. I’ve learned a lot in the process about the legislative system in the United Methodist Church, and I know that whether this passes this year or not, that I am making a difference, and you can, too! - Pastor Kristina
